Dear Etz Chaim Community

We are the Co-Chairs of Ealing Synagogue and are writing on behalf of our whole community here in West London, England.

We can imagine your pain, anguish and deep sadness. All we can do is try to share the impact of those terrible experiences which befell your community on Shabbat.

This morning at our Sunday minyan, we recited psalms and said prayers for the recovery of the injured. Ordinarily, Kaddish for mourners is recited by one nominated member of the congregation and if present those with yahrzeit. When the nominated member began the kaddish, the whole minyan joined in spontaneously, this had never happened before. We join you in grief, and feel deeply for those who have lost their lives, those who were injured, their families and your congregation.

On Sunday 11 November at 11.00am, wreaths will be laid at the Ealing War Memorial, including those from the Jewish Community.

AJEX PARADE SUNDAY 18 NOVEMBER

This year marks the 84th Anniversary of the AJEX Annual Remembrance Ceremony and Reunion. The Jewish Community have served in the Sovereign's Armed Services for over 300 years.

This Annual Ceremony is attended by both veterans and serving personnel of HM Forces and the Community are invited to show their support for AJEX by attending this important event.

This particular year marks the hundredth anniversary of the end of WWI, descendants of those who served and their families will be present.

The Parade marches from Horse Guards Parade to the Cenotaph where the Chief Rabbi, together with our Chaplains and Clergy conducts the Remembrance Ceremony. This is attended by many important guests.

Please come and join us on this important occasion when the Reviewing Officer will be Lt General Richard Nugee CVO CBE, who will take the Salute at the March Past which follows.

Those able to march should report to Horse Guards Parade by 1.30pm and those who do not wish to march may join with members of the public, watching from Whitehall by the Cenotaph.
